Description

This one-week, intensive summer institute aims to broaden and deepen K-12 educators' knowledge of and resources for teaching about Hispanic (Spanish-speaking) cultures of the Americas. Sessions will include presentations and discussions led by MSU faculty, K-12 resources and teaching ideas, and opportunities to network with MSU faculty and teachers. Teams or groups of educators from the same district are encouraged to participate (in particular, Spanish, social studies, world history and ESL teachers). SBCEU credits are available.

Participant's Commitments

- Attend all 5 half-day sessions of the summer institute
- Complete a brief questionnaire
- Complete one module (individual or group) on a theme/region
- Continue integrating Latin America/Hispanic cultures into the curriculum where possible.

In this summer institute we will explore the following topics and regions with particular attention to "reading" or critically examining how Latin America/Latin American-ness is represented and how stereotypes may be reinforced in K-12 textbooks and curricular resources.
